CIVIL DEFENSE CARDS A MUST

As we discussed several times last season, ***no one will be allowed to participate in trainings or searches this year without a Civil Defense card*** issued by the Placer County Sheriff's Department.

These cards are easily procured, cost nothing, and last forever without renewal, but they are necessary in order to be covered by county insurance in case of injury, death, or equipment damage.

We are attempting to have a Sheriff's Department representative on hand at the October meeting to issue cards *en masse* to those active team members who need them. Please be sure you have yours if you intend to go out on any trainings or searches (and we hope you do!).

TNSAR BUDGET APPROVED

The Tahoe Nordic Search and Rescue Team Board of Directors approved the 1987-88 Budget at its July meeting. The committees were budgeted about \$1,200 more than last year, with slight increases in the Education, Public Relations and Secretary budgets.

The Education Committee was budgeted \$1,650; Equipment Committee, \$2,150; Public Relations, \$400; Newsletter, \$1,300; Secretary, \$300; Training, \$500; Transportation, \$1,600.



FIRST TRAINING PLANS UNDERWAY

Details of the first training of the season will be announced at the General Meeting at Granlibakken. The training is promised to be a fun event and is scheduled for October.

ROUBAIX RIDERSHIP DOWN

For the third consecutive August, TNSAR participated in the Tahoe Roubaix mountain bike race in Blackwood Canyon. As always TNSAR members were stationed along the race route to provide water, medical assistance, directions, and radio communications, and Com Team member Bob Williams coordinated over the airwaves from atop the pass.

This year for the first time the team also operated the beer concession, having accepted race promoter David Carmazzi's offer to raise funds by selling beverages in addition to the \$1 per rider donation he promised the team in return for our services.

However this year approximately 190 of an expected 400 contestants were registered, and TNSAR barely broke even on the beer sales. As of press time the additional \$190 had not been forwarded to the team treasurer.
